

**TEMPORARY/EMERGENCY PETITION FOR:
GUARDIANSHIP AND/OR CONSERVATORSHIP OF AN MINOR
(These Petitions are set on the Commissioners' calendars)**

Follow the steps below:

1. Complete the forms entitled:
"Petition for Temporary Minor
Guardian or Conservator" [[hyperlink to
packet>self-service forms>probate](#)]

2. File the necessary documents with:
Probate Clerk
Pima County Superior Court

Tucson, AZ 85701
-and-
Pay the filing Fee [<hyperlink to Clerk's fees](#)

3. The Clerk will send the documents to a
Commissioner for Review. The Commissioner's
Judicial Administrative Assistant (JAA) will call you
and give you a time and date for the hearing.
Usually set within 24 hours to five days, depending
on the emergency.

4. You will be instructed to call a Court Appointed Attorney who
must represent the proposed minor on the date and time
provided by the JAA. You must call the Probate Clerk's office
[<link to phone number>](#) and they will provide you with three
attorney names and numbers to call. When you find an attorney
who is available, call and provide the name to the Probate
Clerk's Office. The court appointed attorney's name must be
inserted into the [Order Appointing Attorney, Medical
Professional and Investigator](#) and filed with the Probate Clerk.

6. If the temporary/emergency hearing is not
contested, the Judge will set a permanent hearing
in 4-6 weeks for the permanent petition. A court
appointed investigator will call you to set up an
appointment to meet with you, the proposed ward
and anyone else who they feel is necessary for
their report to the Court.

5. On the date of the hearing, if anyone is contesting the
appointment [<hyperlink to objection form>](#), the Judge will
complete the hearing and make a ruling on a temporary
appointment. A hearing will then be scheduled in 2-3 weeks
to set status and scheduling conference. At that conference,
the Court will set a trial date in 4-6 weeks.
